

Texoma RC Modelers Training Program

Outline of Program:

- ❖ The club built a “box” to secure two 40-size trainers. The “box” resides in the mower shed and will be secured from the general population with a keyed pad lock.
 - The Secretary Treasurer will keep a spare key for this lock and provide copies to QUALIFIED INSTRUCTORS.
 - The club installed power to maintain charging and readiness of this equipment.
 - A “Instructor Contact List” will be posted at the club field house and on the club website for trainees to call and coordinate time of instruction.
 - Non Club Members may receive 2 free training sessions with club designated AMA Intro Pilots. After the two training sessions they will be required to join the club for further training.
 - AMA has a 60 day limit on insurance coverage for trainees under the Intro Pilot program. Trainees are required to purchase AMA membership prior to the end of the 60 days for training to continue.
 - The club officers will designate which club members will be certified as AMA Intro Pilots.
- ❖ For the Instructor:
 - Provide your contact information and flying styles to the club web master for posting on the website training page and field house.
 - Instructors are not expected to be "on call" at all times. They are expected to schedule a time of availability when contacted by a trainee. If they are unable to confirm a training time then they will assist the trainee in contacting a different instructor and follow up with that instructor to insure that the trainees needs are met.
 - Instructors are responsible to document all training activities conducted under the AMA Intro Pilot program and send the required form to the AMA as needed.
 - Instructors will provide tools and fuel necessary for training sessions. An instructor may petition the club to reimburse them for fuel when they have a significant number of trainees.
 - Instructors will notify a member of the Board of Directors if equipment needs maintenance.
- ❖ Club Responsibilities
 - The club will submit and pay for Intro Pilot certification for designated club members with the AMA.
 - The club will be responsible for maintenance of the trainer aircraft and associated equipment.
 - If a club provided trainer aircraft is damaged or destroyed, the club will repair or replace it at the discretion of the Board of Directors or the Membership.
 - The club will post all information related to training, including Intro Pilot contact information on the club website and at the field house.
